Sunday Only - approximately four to five hours of training - \$115 includes everything to make the beaded ornaments, lunch, no overnight accommodations. Bring your own needles and crochet hook. Suggested sizes - 2.75 mm dpns and 3.25 mm dpns. Crochet Hook – small enough that beads fit and stitch can be pulled through (1.25 to 1.4 mm)
